

## Doc Films Attendance Requirements for Non-UCID Holders

### Single Tickets

#### Proof of Vaccination

1. Name of Person Vaccinated appears on the document, and corresponds to another I.D. card, such as a passport or state identification card
2. Date of Vaccination(s) is included, and is the convening/event date is at least two weeks after a two-dose vaccine or two weeks after a one-dose vaccine
3. Vaccine Manufacturer is FDA-approved (such as Pfizer, Moderna, J&J) or other World Health Organization approved. Current lists of approved vaccines are found at the end of this document
4. Medical facility administering the vaccination is referenced

#### Proof of Negative COVID-19 Test Result

1. Name of Person Tested appears on the document, and corresponds to another I.D. card, such as a passport or state identification card
2. Date of Test is included, and is within the established recency required for the event (72 hours)
3. Test Results are indicated as NEGATIVE
4. Facility or on-line service administering the test is referenced
5. Type of Test is not required to be referenced on the document

#### Proof of Recent POSITIVE COVID-19 Diagnosis

*Persons recovering from COVID-19 may test with false Positive results for up to 90 days, and therefore may not be able to provide proof of a Negative test.*

1. Name of Person Diagnosed appears on all documents, and corresponds to another I.D. card, such as a passport or state identification card
2. Proof of POSITIVE test result, dated 14 days or more prior to the event and no more than 90 days prior. *Type of Test is not required to be referenced on the document.*
3. Confirmation that the person is not experiencing any COVID-19 symptoms during the days leading up to and the day of the event

### Quarterly Passes

#### Proof of Vaccination

1. Name of Person Vaccinated appears on the document, and corresponds to another I.D. card, such as a passport or state identification card
2. Date of Vaccination(s) is included, and is the convening/event date is at least two weeks after a two-dose vaccine or two weeks after a one-dose vaccine
3. Vaccine Manufacturer is FDA-approved (such as Pfizer, Moderna, J&J) or other World Health Organization approved. Current lists of approved vaccines are found at the end of this document
4. Medical facility administering the vaccination is referenced

At this time, the following vaccines have been authorized by the FDA or WHO, under emergency use authorization/listing, or full authorization in the case of Pfizer/BioNTech, and will satisfy the University's COVID-19 vaccine requirement:

- AstraZeneca (WHO) - 2 shots
- Covishield/Serum Institute of India (WHO) - 2 shots
- Janssen/Johnson & Johnson (FDA) - 1 shot
- Moderna (FDA) - 2 shots
- Pfizer/BioNTech (FDA) - 2 shots
- Sinopharm (WHO) - 2 shots
- Sinovac (WHO) - 2 shots

This list will be updated as other vaccines are authorized.
